General Guidelines for Admission to Bachelor's Degree

- Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
- Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant just prior to seeking admission to the Bachelor degree must be supported by documentary evidence / affidavit as the proof of his / her activities during the period of gap. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.
- The application must be filled by the candidate in his / her own handwriting and should be complete in all respect and supported by all documents:
- An applicant must produce original certificates at the time of admission before admission committee.
- Applicants coming from Board / Universities other than the H.P. Board of School Education / H.P. University must provide Migration Certificate in Original.
- Admission of candidate is liable to be cancelled in case he / she furnishes incomplete / false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The Principal can deny admission to any such student whose conduct is detrimental to the interest. / discipline of the institution
- All admissions shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University.
- Rules of admission are subject to change as per the H.P. University notification issued from time to time.

Eligibility for Admission: Following conditions must be fulfilled before seeking admission to the course.

- B.A. First Semester minimum 33% marks in the senior secondary examination.
- B.Com First semester 45% (40%) for Commerce Students, 33% for Girls Students only) Students from arts side must have secured at least 45% with Math's / Economics as an elective subject.

- Maximum 23 years age as on 1.7.2026 (relaxation in age for SC /ST upto 3 years 25 years for girls students)

Note: HPU Annual Examination Centre Charges and Affiliation Fee to be taken separately in the month of September / October keeping in view the student strength since it is to be divided amongst the total number of students, indicating that more the number of students less will be the fees charged from them and vice -versa.

Fine details: Good Students would avoid fines by obeying all the rules in respect of attendance, examination & payment of dues, the fines chargeable are as:

Absence for whole day Rs. 20/- House test Rs. 50/- (Per Paper)

Attendance and leave Rules:The primary duty of a student is to study. The students are therefore expected to follow the following leave rules:

- According to rules students must put in 75% attendance in every optional and compulsory subject.
- Leave should be got secured only when it is absolutely necessary, maximum leave allowed during a semester is 5 days.
- Leave must be sanctioned from the Principal before it is availed.
- In case of serious illness or unavoidable circumstances application leave signed by the Father / Guardian and supported by a Doctor's Certificate should be submitted.
- Leave application by post is not acceptable.
- Fee shall be paid for the full session.

House Examination:All students are required to appear in the said examination and test held by the college and marks obtained by the students in these examination is recorded or added in Annual examination. House examinations are compulsory for eligibility to appear in the annual examinations, the absentees will be fined according to the rules.

University Annual Examination:U.G. Examination conducted by the HPU will commence in as per date sheet notified by the University.

Eligibility for University Examination:In order to earn eligibility for appearing in the University examination the students are required to attend at least 75% of the total lecture delivered in each subject, and students will have to pass the Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) in addition to above otherwise admission forms will not be verified by the college.

Scholarships:All types of States, Centre and University Scholarships are tenable in this College.

 1. Scholarship will be awarded to four meritorious & needy students having secured minimum 60% marks from low-income group.

2. The scholarship will be awarded to such a student who is not receiving any scholarship from any agency.
3. If no student falls in above criteria, then scholarship will be awarded purely on merit basis.

Note: Students are required to fill up the on-line applications for the above scholarship within the date as notified by the H.P. State Govt. along with copies of required documents and submit the hard copy of the same in the office of this college.

IQAC:The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)** has been established in the college as a pivotal mechanism to foster a culture of quality and continuous improvement. It plays a crucial role in planning, guiding, and monitoring all initiatives related to quality assurance and enhancement. Educational Tours: To broaden horizons and enhance learning beyond the classroom, students are encouraged to participate in educational tours and trips to historical and culturally significant places both within and outside the state. These experiences provide valuable exposure and enrich their understanding of society and heritage.

College Central Students' Association (CSCA):

The College Central Students' Association is constituted on dates notified in accordance with the rules laid down by Himachal Pradesh University. The primary objective of this body is to provide constructive suggestions to the Principal for improving the academic environment and promoting cultural activities. The CSCA plays a vital role in organizing college functions, coordinating the activities of various clubs and associations, and ensuring that student life on campus is purposeful and enriching. It also serves as an important link between the students and the Principal, fostering communication and collaboration.

College Magazine – *Giri Ganga* The annual college magazine *Giri Ganga* is published each year, featuring contributions across multiple sections including Pahari, Planning Forum, Sanskrit, Hindi, Commerce, and English. It serves as a comprehensive record of the institution's academic, cultural, and extracurricular activities throughout the year.

Hostel Facility

The College provide accommodation to 36 Girls in the hostel. The Admission will be strictly on merit basis.

Procedure for Girls Hostel.

- All the girl student seeking admission to the Hostel are required to submit the Hostel
- Admission from as per the schedule notified by the college authority.
- Forms submitted are scrutinized by the Hostel Committee and merit wise list of the students is prepared and displayed on the notice board /website.
- The students who seek admission to the hostel are required to participate in college activities like Sports, Cultural Activities and NSS etc.
- If any seat fall vacant during the session it is filled strictly in accordance with the merit list prepared at the beginning of the session.

Documents/Certificates required for Admission:

The following certificates issued by the competent authority are required for admission in the hostel.

- A medical fitness certificate issued by a medical officer from a govt. Hospital is mandatory.
- SC/ST certificate issued by a 1st Class Magistrate.
- Handicapped certificate issued by the CMO.
- An undertaking is to be given by the parent that his/her ward does not suffer from any physical or mental illness and if she develops any physical or mental illness or abnormality of behaviors during her stay in the college hostel, which may cause hindrance in the daily routine of co-boarders, the college authorities reserve the right to cancel her room allotment in the hostel.
- An undertaking is to be given by the parent that his/her ward will not indulge in any act that comes in the category of ragging.
- Residence proof.

Note: Mess Charges will be charged separately from the student as per the actual expenditure. The Hostel fee and funds may be increased on the recommendation of the Hostel Committee. Usage charges, accruing in excess of the charges already paid, will be charged proportionately from the students.

Girls Hostel Rules

1. Admission & Stay

- Hostel accommodation is allotted only to enrolled students of the college.
- Students must sign the hostel admission form and anti-ragging declaration at the time of entry.
- Rooms are allotted by the warden; no student may change rooms without prior permission.

2. Discipline & Conduct

- Residents must maintain discipline, decorum, and respect towards fellow students and staff.
- Ragging, bullying, or harassment in any form is strictly prohibited.
- Loud music, shouting, or disruptive behavior is not allowed inside hostel premises.
- Use of abusive language or involvement in fights will lead to disciplinary action.

3. Attendance & Timings

- Hostel gates will close at **9:00 PM**; late entry is not permitted without prior approval.
- Students must sign the attendance register daily.
- Night-outs or leave from the hostel require written permission from the warden and intimation to parents.

4. Visitors

- Visitors are allowed only during designated hours and must register at the hostel office.
- Male visitors are strictly prohibited inside hostel rooms.
- Parents/guardians may meet their wards in the visitor's area only.

5. Cleanliness & Maintenance

- Rooms must be kept neat and tidy; inspections may be conducted by the warden.
- Students are responsible for hostel property (furniture, fixtures, etc.) and must not damage or deface it.
- Any damage will be charged to the responsible student.

6. Safety & Security

- Residents must not tamper with electrical fittings or use unauthorized appliances (e.g., heaters, stoves).
- Fire safety rules must be strictly followed.
- Students must carry their hostel ID cards at all times.

7. Food & Mess

- Meals will be served only during fixed timings in the hostel mess.
- Wasting food or removing utensils from the mess is prohibited.
- Complaints regarding food should be addressed to the mess committee or warden.

8. Health & Well-being

- Any illness must be reported immediately to the hostel warden.
- Students are expected to maintain personal hygiene and participate in hostel health awareness programs.

9. Prohibited Activities

- Smoking, alcohol, drugs, and gambling are strictly banned.
- Political or unauthorized meetings inside the hostel are not allowed.
- Use of hostel premises for commercial activities is prohibited.

10. Leave & Vacating

- Students must apply for leave in advance and obtain approval.
- On vacating, rooms must be handed over in proper condition.
- Hostel fees are non-refundable once admission is confirmed.

It is mandatory under the **HIMACHAL PRADESH PRIVATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (REGULATORY COMMISSION) ACT,2010** that all the Private Higher Educational Institutions including Universities & Colleges in the State shall offer approved courses, make admissions on merit, charge fees as approved by the State Govt, conduct fair examination/evaluation and adhere to the relevant regulatory body norms regarding faculty and infrastructure.

Any violation of the norms by the private educational Institutions will attract penal provisions under section 11 of the Act. *ibid*.

RAGGING IS PROHIBITED

Under the orders of the Hon'ble High Court and Hon'ble Supreme Court and the rules framed by the Himachal Pradesh University vide ordinance 22.17 ragging is completely prohibited. Ragging means and includes any type of physical and mental torture done by any individual or a group either by words or by conduct, which gives an apprehension in the mind of person that he cannot pursue his/her studies freely from any mental disturbance/torture created thereby any student found involved in ragging will be summarily expelled from the college and legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated against him/her.
